USE TABBED BROWSING IN SAFARI

The OS X default Internet browser is Safari, and Safari does Tabbed browsing. Tabbed browsing lets you open several Web pages at the same time in a single window, and each is assigned a Tab. Clicking on a tab brings up that Web page.

To enable tabbed browsing, open Safari, click on Safari in the Menu bar at the top of your browsing window, and click on Preferences. Click on the Tabs button and make sure that the "Enable Tabbed Browsing" checkbox is selected.

To use tabs, instead of opening a new browser window to display another web page without closing your current one, use one of the following key stroke combinations.

Command-click	Opens link in a new tab
Command-shift-click	Opens link in a new tab and selects it
Command-Option-click	Opens link in a new windows behind the current one
Command-Option-Shift-click	Opens link in a new window and selects it.

You can switch back and forth between tabs by simply clicking the tabs. If you want to create a new tab to enter a URL, choose New Tab from the File menu (or press Command-T), then type a URL or select a bookmark.
